Holy and Humble

The Easter Season is the pinnacle of our Catholic faith. The death and resurrection of Jesus offers us hope. We learn about the events that lead up to this. The Palm Sunday Gospel story described how Jesus entered into Jerusalem riding a young donkey, the townspeople saying Hosanna! They threw clothes, palms or small branches in front of Him as a sign of admiration and worship. In the times of Jesus this was a customary practice for people of great respect. The palm branches were a symbol of peace and victory. Fr Peter spoke to us of the importance of steadfastness and humility in our lives.

Humility is the opposite of aggressiveness, arrogance, boastfulness, and vanity. Rather than, thinking 'me first,' humility allows us to say, 'No, you first, my friend.' Humility dissolves anger and heals wounds. In the Bible, humility or humbleness is the quality of being courteous and respectful of others. For His entry into Jerusalem, the use of a donkey by Jesus instead of a horse is highly symbolic. It represents the humble arrival of someone in peace. Throughout the events of Holy Week Jesus models this quality of humility. Particularly at the washing of the feet, Jesus showed us through His actions to serve others. Humility distinguishes a wise leader from the power-seeker. It allows us to see the dignity and worth of all God's people.

On Holy Thursday St Mary's School shared with the community our enactment of the Holy Week story. Participating in the liturgy enables each of the students to embody the quality of humility, as well as consider and reflect on the significance of the sacrifice Jesus made for us. I am so extremely proud of each of our students, and the staff for composing a most beautiful, moving, reflective liturgy. The reverence of the students was extraordinary.

To believe in the resurrection, is to believe in God. To act with humility allows us to put God and other persons ahead of our own selfish interests. It is the quality that is needed to live in peace and harmony with all people.

HENDERSON OVAL YOOGALI PLAYGROUND UPGRADE

Construction work at the playground at Henderson Oval Yoogali has commenced.

This is a \$125,000 project and includes \$50,000 funded by the Department of Planning, Industry and Environment under the Everyone Can Play program to provide an inclusive playground. Everyone Can Play aims to provide people of all ages, abilities and cultural backgrounds with an opportunity to play.

Council will be upgrading the play equipment with shade shelter, seating and bin enclosure, and extending the shared pathway from Gorton Street to the playground.

It is envisaged that the construction will be completed by the end of April 2021. (GCC website)

St Mary's have been invited to make their mark with painted hand prints on the playground. This will take place next term. The official opening of the playground is on April 14th.

Join us for author & psychologist Krysten Taprell's launch of her book


The Dream Director.

This book gives children the skills to take control of their own dreams and empowers them to change the endings of their dreams.


The book uses humorous examples of dreams and how they can be changed to reduce fear around sleep.
